- Increase visitor engagement by creating a multipurpose room that will help us grow youth and senior's recreational programs while also opening new tourism partnership opportunities.
- Make the Museum a publicly accessible site with an elevator, walkways, signage, and restrooms, so no one has to feel excluded.
- Amplify community voices and stories with interactive exhibitons that explore our diverse and significant history through new display spaces.
- Protect our artefacts by installing fire suppression systems and adding new collections storage space, so they can be safeguarded for future generations.
- Reuse our heritage buildings to help reduce carbon emissions, upgrade our insulation, lighting, and window glazing, and provide heat pumps to ensure energy efficiency.
